- MAY First Safety Coffee Break at Bloomsdale is cancelled. Work is started on new building after permits obtained. Ronald McDonald House cancels dinners, a \$200.00 donation is sent. The Annual Session of the Grand Lodge is cancelled. New Grand Lodge officers installed in a private ceremony in Rolla, Missouri. Word received that Past Grand Robert Ruester had passed.
- JUNE The second Safety Coffee Break is cancelled, the annual picnic is rescheduled for August. Brothers Michael Morgan and Leroy Rayfield passes.
- JULY Annual banquet cancelled due to restrictions on attendance. Lodge continues to meet at Five Star Senior Center for officers only. Brother Ray White commissioned Deputy Grand Master by Grand Master Gene Collins.
- AUG. The third and final Safety Coffee Break of 2020 is cancelled. The annual banquet and picnic are cancelled. Lodge votes to erect a "pole barn" at the new building. Word received that the Sovereign Grand Lodge will not meet this year. All officers are being held over until 2021. Grand Lodge of Missouri will hold over present officers until 2022. Brother David Masterson passes.
- SEPT. Lodge is still meeting at Five Star Senior Center. Lodge donates \$1,000.00 to Five Star Senior Center for repairs to building. November 8, 2020 set as date for Fun Bowling Tournament. Brother Fred Baerenz passes.
- OCT. Lodge No. 5 donates new tables and chairs for new building. Lodge invests \$100,000.00 in new stock purchases. Lodge Children Christmas party is cancelled. Lodge starting time is changed to 7:00 P.M. when we move into new building. Brother Sam Wilk passes.
- NOV. Lodge meets for last time at the Five Star Senior Center on November 21, 2020. The new building passes occupancy inspection. Fun Bowling Tournament is cancelled. Lodge meets for first time in new building on November 28, 2020. Lodge opens up meetings to all members starting on Past Grands night, December 5, 2020.
- DEC. Brother Thomas Moser is elected as Noble Grand for 2021. Brother Jeff Parrotte is the new Vice Grand. Donations made to various Charities totaling \$138,000.00 from both Lodge No. 5 treasury and the Robertson Benevolent Fund. Morning meetings held on 12/26 and 1/2/21.

The fun of Driving in St. Louis

If you live in St Louis you'll understand this. If you've ever visited St. Louis you'll understand this. If you've never been to St. Louis consider this your Visitor's Guide to Driving in St. Louis.

- 1. There are 75 "unofficial neighborhoods" in the City of St. Louis. St. Louisans commonly give directions--especially for restaurants--to strangers based on these neighborhoods, which aren't marked on any maps that are handed out by the tourist board, the AAA or MapQuest.
- 2. There are 54 school districts--on the Missouri side alone--each of which has their own school bus system with scheduled times to block traffic. There are 91 official municipalities in St. Louis County. Each municipality has its own rules and regulations, and often their own police departments.
- 3. Any car parked longer than 4 hours in the city is considered a parts store.
- 4. Laclede Station Road, McCausland, Lindbergh, Watson, Reavis Barracks, Fee Fee, McKnight, Airport Road, Midland, McKelvey, and Olive mysteriously change names as you cross intersections. Additionally, Manchester which is also Choteau, and Dr. M.L. King which is also St. Charles Rock Road (although it no longer goes to St. Charles).
- 5. Gravois Road, Spoede and Chouteau can only be pronounced by St. Louis natives. (Highway 40 is pronounced as "farty.")
- 6. A St. Louisan from South County has never been to North County and vise versa. West County just has everything delivered.
- 7. No native St. Louisan knows that Lindbergh runs from South County to North County. And if you tell them, they will not believe.
- 8. Lindbergh belongs to every neighborhood except Kirkwood, who had the nerve to creatively change the name to Kirkwood Road. (Which may be the reason for number). Never ever try to cross a bridge in St. Louis during rush hour unless you have a sack lunch and a port-a-potty in the car.
- 9 "Yield" signs are for decoration only. No native St. Louisan will ever grasp the concept. (Actually, the drivers who are supposed to yield will not, and the drivers who are not supposed to yield will wait politely for the ones who are supposed to yield, so it all works out.)
- 10. If someone actually has their turn signal on, it is probably a factory defect, or has been on for the last 17 miles.





Membership Dues


