These things are so ingrained in our American way of life we don't give them a second thought. We are so well off here in the United States that our poverty line begins 31 times above the global average. Thirty One Times. Virtually no one in the United States is considered poor by global standards. Yet, in a time where we can order a product off Amazon with one click and have it at our doorstep the next day, we are unappreciative, unsatisfied, and ungrateful. Our un-appreciation is evident as the popularity of socialist policies among my generation continues to grow. Congresswoman Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez recently said to Newsweek talking about the millennial generation, "An entire generation, which is now becoming one of the largest electorates in America, came of age and never saw American prosperity."

COMMUNICATION



One of the most important duties that an officer, committee chairman, committee or other person of responsibility, is to communicate. There are different means of communication these days, letter, facsimile, email, one on one, phone calls, newsletters, etc. We sometimes ignore the basics of communications and take for granted the other person or persons know what we are trying to communicate, it's called assumption. There are some simple rules for better communications we can follow and one of these are the five W's.

WHO; who are we communicating with? Who needs the communication and how many are we communicating with?

WHAT; what is the purpose of the communication. If you are sending an email, this should be the header.

WHY; why are we communicating, the reason, or purpose?

WHERE; is a location needed, or an area or building, convention center, etc.

WHEN; is there a specific date required? Is a time needed? Here is where a lot of people make assumptions that the recipient knows this already. Don't assume!

When making a communication, just follow the simple five W's and you will eliminate a lot of problems that come from poor communications. I remember one time I had put an article in the lodge newsletter that a certain Grand Master was going to hold a BBQ as a joke. I was chastised by that Grand Master due to all the phone calls he had received asking where and when was the BBQ.

Always, when communicating, make the message as plain and as simple as you can. I follow the KISS principle (Keep It Simple Stupid) to avoid misunderstandings. Never underestimate the power of a good communication or the problems caused by a poor communication.

The Old Man And The Gulls

About sunset it happened every Friday evening, on a lonely stretch along the eastern Florida seacoast. You could see an old man walking, white-haired, bushy-eye browed, slightly bent. One gnarled hand would be gripping the handle of a pail, a large bucket filled with shrimp. There, on a broken pier reddened by the setting sun, the weekly ritual would be re-enacted. At once, the silent twilight sky would become a mass of dancing dots . . . growing larger. In the distance, screeching calls would become louder. They were sea gulls, come from nowhere, on the same pilgrimage . . . to meet an old man.

For half an hour or so, the gentleman would stand on the pier, surrounded by fluttering white, till his pail of shrimp was empty. But the gulls would linger for a while. Perhaps one would perch comfortably on the old man's hat . . . and a certain day gone by would gently come to mind. Eventually, all of the old man's days would past. If the gulls still return to that spot . . . perhaps on a Friday evening at sunset . . . it is not for food . . . but to pay homage to the secret they shared with a gentle stranger. And that secret is **THE REST OF THE STORY**.

Anyone who remembers October of 1942 remembers the day it was reported the Captain Eddie Rickenbacker was lost at sea. Captain Eddie's mission had been to deliver a message of the utmost importance to General MacArthur. MacArthur was headquartered in New Guinea, and Rickenbacker was given a B-17 and a hand-picked crew to take him there. But there was an unexpected detour which would hurl Captain Eddie into the most harrowing adventure of his life. Somewhere over the South Pacific the Flying Fortress became lost beyond the reach of radio. Fuel ran dangerously low, so the men ditched their plane in the ocean. The B-17 stayed afloat just long enough for all aboard to get out. Then, slowly, the tail of Flying Fortress swung up and posed for a split second . . . and the ship went down, leaving eight men and three rafts . . . and the horizon. For nearly a month Captain Eddie and his companions would fight the water, and the weather, and the scorching sun.

They spent many sleepless nights recoiling as giant sharks rammed their rafts. The largest raft was nine by five. The biggest shark . . . ten feet long. But of all their enemies at sea, one proved most formidable: starvation. Eight days out, their rations were long gone or destroyed by the salt water. It would take a miracle to sustain them. And a miracle occurred. In Captain Eddie's own words, "Cherry," that was the B-17 pilot, Captain William Cherry, "read the service that afternoon, and we finished with a prayer for deliverance and a hymn of praise. There was some talk, but it tapered off in the oppressive heat. With my hat pulled down over my eyes to keep out some of the glare, I dozed off." Now this is still Captain Rickenbacker talking . . . "Something landed on my head. I knew that it was a sea gull. I don't know how I knew, I just knew. "Everyone else knew too. No one said a word, but peering out from under my hat brim without moving my head, I could see the expression on their faces. They were staring at that gull. The gull meant food . . . if I could catch it." And the rest, as they say, is history.
